Just under half of the reception cohort achieved GLD this year. Although this is below national, it represents a considerable improvement on last year. This improvement has been achieved by raising attainment in the core subjects of literacy and numeracy, but especially in Writing.

### KS1

Attainment in the Year 1 Phonics screening check was achieved by 56% this figure has shown improvement year on year. Given the low attainment of these children in literacy when they were in Reception from significantly low 2 year-old data, this should be seen as a real success. Pass rates in Year 2 are very high - 93%, meaning that nearly every child going in to Year 3 has a good grasp of phonics.

Attainment in greater depth Reading exceeds national, while Maths is below. About a third of the year group had SEN; their low attainment has had a major impact on overall results -

Results at KS2 are on an upward trajectory - 28% of children achieved the expected standards in combined Reading, Writing and in Maths at KS2. The fact that almost a third of the year group has SEN and most of these children are also Disadvantaged, puts this into perspective. The attainment of EAL children is good.
