PE-Kit- Please make sure your child has a PE-Kit in all week at school and if your child has verruca's please make sure they are being treated and they are very contagious.

Staffing - Mrs Charman's and Ms Gergowich babies arrived last half term, the babies are gorgeous and are all doing well.

Road Crossing - Please do park and use the school crossing patrol. This will help ease congestion at the front of the school. Please be careful as parking on yellow zigzags will incur a fine.
